

# Properties of an e-assessment system

## Different types of properties

For the purpose of this Wiki, the properties of an e-assessment system will be divided into the following categories:

- Functional properties
- Architectural properties
- Content exchange specifications

## Assessment types and items

## System architecture

Ideally, an assessment system would implement the following architecture properties<sup>1)</sup>:

- designed as a standalone e-assessment system,
- ability to exchange content, user data and components with other e-assessment systems,
- pluggable into LMS (*learning management systems*), or other systems

## Other requests

- flexibility to include assessments based on different theories and models,
- completeness of the supported assessment process,
- reusability (identification, isolation and exchange) of useful objects (items, assessment plans)
- medium neutrality (when possible, the system also supports paper and pencil tests)
